Awareness + Intervention = Prevention

Each year approximately 526,000 college students experience violent crimes, including robbery, false imprisonment, kidnap, aggravated assault, domestic violence, rape, and acquaintance rape.

- 26% of college females are victims of domestic violence or sexual crimes – at fraternity parties or in their own dorms.
- At least 80% of all sexual assaults are committed by an acquaintance of the victim.
- At least 1 in 4 college women will be the victim of a sexual assault during her academic career.
- In a survey of high school students, 56% of girls and 76% of boys (many of whom were entering college) believed forced sex was acceptable under some circumstances. *Acquaintance Rape: When students transition from high school to college, they must have effective tools to stay safe!*
- Many students become victims of crimes between the first day of school and the Thanksgiving holiday.

Awareness + Intervention = Prevention

Awareness: We should tell students the truth about the dangers that lurk around them -- with complete honesty, without pulling any punches.

Intervention: Meet them on their ground. Don't tell them not to go to parties; tell them what to look out for at parties. Consistently provide them with the necessary tools, insight, and information that will help them make rational, logical decisions when they face a potentially harmful situation.

Prevention: You can prevent students from falling prey to harm.

With Awareness + Intervention, they can also prevent their peers and siblings from becoming victims.
